

There was probably a lot of commotion around, but there was also a profound silence as Christ grew in His human body. Great preparation had been made for the Christ child, yet the events of His early childhood are mostly silent in Scripture. I often wonder what was happening during those silent years.

The truth is that God is frequently silent in our lives, moving quietly when we do not notice. I am reflecting on this idea as we emerge from the Christmas season. In January, we will explore the silence associated with the book of Habakkuk—a critical text that will help us grapple with the silence we often feel in relation to God. If you have ever wondered about God's presence in the silence of your life, this conversation is for you.

I want to extend a special thank you to our Personnel Committee for their diligent work in preparing for Cathy Holland's retirement. We are incredibly grateful for Cathy and her ministry among us. The Personnel Committee is actively planning the next steps for our music ministry, and many individuals have stepped up to provide leadership during this transition.
