The word "staycation" emerged during the 2008 economic downturn when many families couldn't afford traditional vacations. By 2009, it had officially entered our vocabulary, recognized by Merriam-Webster's dictionary. What began as a budgetfriendly alternative has evolved into something more meaningful. As followers of Christ, we're called to see our communities through His eyes—not just as places we happen to live, but as mission fields where we can serve with purpose and love.

Remember Jesus's words in Acts 1:8? He called disciples to be witnesses "in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Our "Jerusalem"—our immediate community—is where ministry often begins.





### FBCJST Event-Waterworks Visual Arts Center-Salisbury, NC

On Saturday, July 12th, Jubilant Seniors will travel to Waterworks Visual Arts Center in Salisbury. We need to reserve our guided tour no later than Monday, June 9th. After the reservation is confirmed on June 9th, a schedule will be provided.

Waterworks Visual Arts Center has an exhibition of paintings and sculptures from the personal collection of the late New York philanthropists, Julian and Josie Robertson. "Never before seen modern masterpieces" include more than 40 works by leading European modern artists: Bonnard, Kandinsky, Monet, Picasso, and de Kooning. Spanning over 100 years of art history, the works will provide a vivid sense of key movements from Cubism to Abstract Expressionism. Julian Robertson was born in Salisbury and remained dedicated to the town throughout his life. His commitment took many forms, including the founding of the Blanche and Julian Robertson Family Foundation, which he established in honor of his parents to support local programs and organizations within the community they loved.
