Finding Our Place

Of all the things you worry about when you're driving, the health of your taillight probably isn't one of them. I heard a story about a guy driving home late one night on a dark road. He wasn't speeding or doing anything wrong, but suddenly, blue lights filled his rearview mirror. When the officer got to his window, he simply said, "Sir, did you know your left taillight is out?" Just one small bulb, one tiny part of a complex machine, wasn't doing its job, and it was enough to bring the whole car to a halt.

That story got me thinking about our church. It's natural to see the most visible parts—the teaching, the music, the public prayers—and think that's where the important people do their work. We can start to believe that our own quiet contributions, the ones that nobody sees or applauds, don't carry the same weight. But the things done away from the spotlight are often the most powerful.

It reminds me of what Jesus taught his followers in the Sermon on the Mount. In Matthew 6, he talks about acts of faith like giving, praying, and fasting. He makes it clear that our motivation is what truly matters. He encourages us to give without fanfare and to pray in private, not for the praise of others, but for an audience of one. Jesus promises that our Father, who "sees what is done in secret," will reward us. The most meaningful service isn't seen by people, but seen only by God.

So much of the vital work of our church happens in that very spirit. The prayer that is offered quietly for a struggling family, the meal delivered to a home, the time spent preparing a meal—these are the acts of service that form the true foundation of our community. You may be the person who writes an encouraging note, listens to a friend in need, or cleans up after a fellowship meal. These are the things done in secret, the righteous acts that God sees and honors. This is our conversation for August!

Notes From Cole

Looking back on my life I see a beautiful storyline of God directing me towards being a Minister of Music, particularly here at First Baptist of Mount Holly. My musical journey began with violin lessons at age 4 and my faith journey began shortly after at age 5. The two became intertwined by age 11 when I began playing for the hymns and communion every week at my childhood church, Heritage Bible Fellowship, in Hope Mills, NC.

My love of music waxed and waned through my teenage years, but God placed the irrefutable truth of my calling in my face by ending my athletic dreams and opening doors as a professional musician all within my Junior year of high school. Meanwhile, the eyes of my faith were expanding as my family travelled from church to church seeking a new home in various denominations. All the while, my violin came along and was played at Sunday morning services and Saturday evening weddings, in Anglican mass and Pentecostal praise, in English cathedrals and Japanese house churches.

In March of 2016 I met another Sophomore at UNC Greensboro, Tori Patterson. Little did I know at the time that she would straighten my path into ministry. The lovely young lady, who is now your Minister of Children and Youth, was already at that time several years into her ministerial journey and it did not take much foresight to realize her calling was to lead young people to the Lord. What might have taken some by surprise is that Tori would, over the course of nine years, convince this scattered artist that he was called to minister to the world through music.

As long a journey as it has taken me to arrive in Mount Holly, it is my privilege to be here with my family through marriage - and my family in Christ at First Baptist. I look forward to living out this story for many years to come.
