Together, we will explore how to treat technology as a tool for our spiritual good. We will discuss forming habits that use technology to help us grow, rather than pull us apart.

Notes From Cole



"Mankind is always changing; God's truth stands forever. And He has many ways of speaking to us, regardless of the human instruments he uses." - Thomas Aquinas

In times such as the last several weeks filled with tragedies, both local and abroad, we find ourselves looking for a constant in the world. Something that stays the same amidst the chaos of our lives. How easily we forget that God's truth is that constant. Scripture reminds us continually of God's steadfastness:

"Know, therefore, that the LORD your God is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments, to a thousand generations." - Deuteronomy 7:9

The most striking part of Aquinas' reminder is the second half of the above quote. The fact that in addition to the truth we find in God's Word, we also find evidence of His presence in the other humans around us, especially those in the Church. How often we are reminded of God's love by Pastor Jeff's sermons, conversations in Sunday School, or even simply a hug during the passing of the peace. But perhaps even more noticeable is the subtle implication in that simple quote that we are to be the hands and feet of Christ; we are to be the ones who spread his Truth:

"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." - Ephesians 2:10

So, as we enter into this fall season of holidays and gatherings, let us be mindful of how we are a reminder to others of God's presence in the world, just as they can be to us.

On a similar note, if you feel God leading you to share His love through a musical or artistic talent, please do not hesitate to reach out to me. First Baptist continues to be a sanctuary for nurturing gifts and talents of all types. We would love to share in yours.
