THE TRIUMPH – Death Has Been Swallowed

Verse to Memorize – 1 Corinthians 15:54-57

"Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

If resurrection is true, four things shift in reality:

1. Death is no longer inevitable.

2. Suffering is reframed.

If Jesus stayed dead, His suffering would be tragedy. But if He rose, His suffering was _____. God saying: "I enter your suffering, and I will remake everything."

3. Justice is guaranteed.

If death wins, injustice wins—the oppressor escapes. But if Christ rose, God has shown His commitment to _____. He will renew creation.

4. Your life is no longer just waiting to die.

THE ALREADY/NOT YET

The Tension:

"If Christ rose and death is defeated, why do people still die? Why is the world still broken?"
